This report is intended solely for the information and use of management, and for filing with the Auditor General of the State of Arizona, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.



*NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES*

The Annual Expenditure Limitation Report (AELR) is presented on the basis of accounting prescribed by the *Uniform Expenditure Reporting System (UERS)*, as required by Arizona Revised Statutes §41-1279.07, and in accordance with the voter-approved alternative expenditure limitation adopted March 13, 2003, as authorized by the Arizona Constitution, Article IX, §20(9).

*NOTE 2 - SEPARATE LEGAL ENTITIES*

The subtraction of \$556,500 for separate legal entities established under Arizona Revised Statutes consists of expenditures of the Town's municipal property corporation included within the Town's reporting entity and are reported in the Nonmajor Governmental Funds category in the basic financial statements.
